REPORT

on a visit to the

WEST AFRICAN DISTRICTS.

-----oCo-----

In presenting a report on my visit to the West African Districts, I desire to acknowledge the goodness of God in whose care I journeyed and laboured in safety and in comfort from the day that I sailed to the day that I landed.

Sailing from Liverpool on the 28th of October 1914, I landed in Freetown, Sierra Leone on the 8th of November. In that District I spent five weeks in consultation with the missionaries, the Native Ministers, and the leading laymen of the Church, and in visiting Churches and inspecting work both in the Colony and Protectorate.

Landing in Lagos on the 17th of December, I spent between five and six weeks similarly meeting the brethren and travelling as far North as Oyo and Ilesha and West as far as Porto Novo in the French Colony of Iahomey.

On the Gold Coast I spent two whole months travelling over the greater part of that extensive District and in attending the Synod. On my return journey I landed again at Freetown where I spent a fortnight dealing with matters of special difficulty in connection with the finances of the new High School Building.

The infrequency and uncertainty of shipping prevented my giving the time to the Gambia that I had hoped to give. I was able however to spend the greater part of two days ashore and in that time met the Church and various committees in Bathurst, inspected the property, gave the prizes to the apprentices of the Industrial School and visited Cape St. Mary.

My enquiry in every place has extended to practically all questions of Missionary policy, and efficiency of work, whether related to the Church or to the manifold forms of evangelistic effort.





